Remains Of WW II Found

Military scientists have identified the remains of an Indiana soldier who died in World War II when the tank he was commanding was struck by an anti-tank round during a battle in Germany.

The Defense POW/MIA Accounting agency says that the remains of U.S. Army 2nd Lt. Gene F. Walker of Richmond, Indiana, were identified in July, nearly 79 years after his death.

Walker was 27 and commanded an M4 Sherman tank in November 1944 when his unit battled German forces near Huchen, Germany, and his tank was struck by an anti-tank round.

His remains will be buried in San Diego, California, in early 2024. DPAA said Walker's name is recorded on the Walls of the Missing at Netherlands American Cemetery in Margraten, Netherlands, and a rosette will be placed next to his name to indicate he has been accounted for.

More and more Veterans are found and identified, brought home to be buried alongside their loved ones.
