Military sexual trauma has far reaching affects. It has a significant affect on family of the survivor.

- Victims have a hard time opening up to family and sharing their experiences.

- Children may not know how to express their worry about the parent.
- Victims may feel uneasy or on edge when engaging with family or in social gatherings.

- Children may look to the other parent for caregiving making victim feel they are no longer needed.
- Victims may disconnect and withdraw including from family members.
- Spouses try to get unwanted help for the victim
- Children may misbehave because they don't understand the changes in the parent.
- Victims have trust issues and may not feel safe.
- Spouses try to understand why they are not trusted.
