SOME STAGGERING FACTS ABOUT VETERAN SUICIDES

- ♦ VETERANS ARE AT 72% HIGHER RISK OF SUICIDE THAN THOSE WHO HAVEN'T SERVED.
- ◆ THE RATE OF SUICIDE AMONG WOMEN VETERANS IS NEARLY DOUBLE THAT FOR NON-VETERAN WOMEN.
- ◆ THE 35-54 YEAR OLD VETERAN AGE GROUP HAS EXPERIENCED A SIGNIFICANT IN-CREASE IN AGE-SPECIFIC SUICIDE RATE.
- SUICIDE IS THE SECOND-LEADING CAUSE OF DEATH FOR POST 9/11 VETERANS.
- ◆ SINCE 2021, MORE THAN 50% OF VETERAN SUICIDES OCCURRED OUTSIDE VETERANS HEALTH ADMINISTRATION CARE.
