Legislative priority goal-

Health Care: To ensure service members and veterans receive timely access to high-quality health care without increasing cost shares, Congress, VA, and DOD must: • Eliminate service member and veteran suicide by addressing both clinical and non-clinical needs. • Strengthen care and research for mental health and traumatic brain injuries. • Improve oversight of Vet Centers to ensure adequate staffing, resources, and funding. • Enhance programs and services for women and underserved veterans. • Eliminate copayment requirements for preventive health care and medications. • Research the efficacy of medical cannabis and other alternative therapies. • Preserve the integrity of TRICARE. • Properly implement VA and DOD health IT systems. • Expand nursing home eligibility and long-term care options. • Enhance services for veterans outside of the United States.
