Flag Education, POW/MIA Recognition, Star Family Recognition

POW/MIA display and presentation guidelines center on honoring missing service members through strict flag precedence and the solemn "Missing Man Table" ceremony.

Flag Display Protocol

- **Single Flagpole:** The POW/MIA flag must fly directly below and be no larger than the United States flag.
- **Separate Flagpoles:** The U.S. flag must always be placed to the right (the observer's left) of all other flags.
- **Mandatory Dates:** Public law mandates displaying the flag on six national observances: Armed Forces Day, Memorial Day, Flag Day, Independence Day, National POW/MIA Recognition Day, and Veterans Day.
- **Indoor Presentation:** Official indoor sets (like the Sunward Flag Presentation Set) feature an 8-foot oak pole paired with a weighted brass stand and ceremonial nylon flags

The Missing Man Table Ceremony

The table is set for a single person to represent the frailty of a lone prisoner and symbolize their absence.

- **White Tablecloth:** Symbolizes the purity of their intentions when answering the nation's call.
- **Empty Chair:** Signifies that the service member is not present.
- **Single Red Rose / Yellow Ribbon:** Reminds families and friends of the ongoing hope for return.
- **Slice of Lemon & Salt:** Represents the bitter fate of captivity and the tears of waiting families.
- **Inverted Glass:** Indicates that the missing cannot toast with the attendees that evening.
- **Candle:** Symbolizes the enduring light of hope.

August 1: Air Force Day – Commemorates the establishment of the U.S. Air Force.

August 4: Coast Guard Day – Celebrates the founding of the U.S. Coast Guard in 1790.

August 7: Purple Heart Day – Honors the men and women who were wounded or killed in combat.

August 10: Agent Orange Awareness Day
August 14: Navajo Code Talkers Day
August 19: National Aviation Day

The VFW Auxiliary uses meeting rituals to honor fallen veterans, promote patriotism, ensure orderly meetings, and maintain organizational unity. These structured traditions—such as specific gavel raps, opening/closing prayers, and flag salutes—keep members aligned with the group's historical values and mission.

The Auxiliary observes these traditions to accomplish several goals:

- **Honoring Fallen Comrades:** Rituals such as opening and closing the Bible and specific chaplain prayers treat the meeting space as sacred ground to remember veterans who have passed away.
- **Promoting Patriotism:** Standardized practices—such as the **heart salute** to the Flag or military salute for veteran members—demonstrate unwavering respect for the country and the flag.
- **Ensuring Order and Efficiency:** Specific traditions like using specific **raps of the gavel** (e.g., one rap for attention, two to rise, three to sit) and requiring members to address the President prevent chaos and keep business discussions on track.
- **Fostering Continuity:** Following a documented format (like the Traditional or Contemporary Agendas outlined in the VFW Auxiliary Podium Edition) helps members and new posts stay united under the same national values.

While the traditional floor work helps maintain these historical bonds, local chapters can opt for "Roundtable" meetings that omit the strict rituals if they need to prioritize time efficiency.

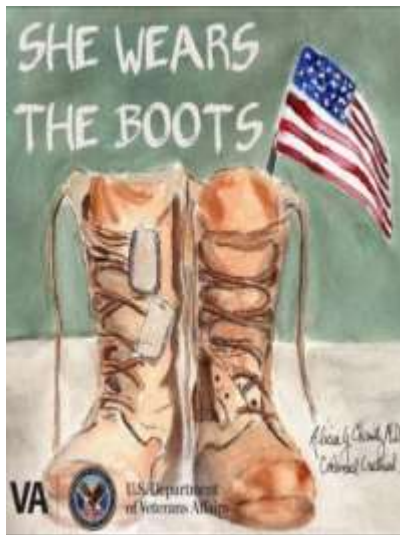

Awards are given by the VA annually, for hours earned, and special recognitions. This is in addition to awards from the Auxiliary. Are you interested?

* Being a certified volunteer holds the most prestigious volunteer position representing our organization in their VA Medical Center.

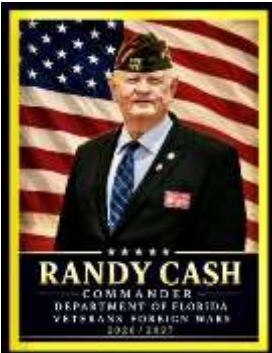

Work Hand in Hand with Your VFW Post

Voice of Democracy and Patriot's Pen are VFW programs. Coordinate with your local participating Post before sharing submission instructions.

- Confirm the Post Scholarship Chairman and best contact information.
- Ask whether the Post is accepting entries through Scholars App, by email with permission, or directly at the Post.
- Request the current official entry forms and use the Post's exact submission directions.
- Offer Auxiliary help with school outreach, reminders, publicity and participant recognition.

Make Back-to-School Outreach Easy

When contacting schools, provide one clear message: the theme, eligible grades, required format, October 31 deadline and the local VFW Post contact. Ask that the information be shared through school announcements, newsletters, scholarship portals, classroom assignments and parent communications.

Help Students Grow

- Arrange for a veteran to speak with local students or youth groups about service, citizenship, and lessons learned.
- Set up a Scholarships Information Table or display at a library, school open house, community center, youth event, or local festival
- Encourage original work and remind students to carefully follow every entry requirement.
- Follow up in September so interested students do not lose momentum.

Recognition Starts Now

Begin planning a "Red Carpet" celebration for all scholarship participants—not only the winners. Certificates, photos, refreshments, patriotic decorations and a chance for students to share their work can make every entrant feel valued. Department and National Red Carpet award entries are due to the Department Scholarships Chairman by March 31, 2027.

Report the Work You Are Growing

Reports may include school contacts, entry-form distribution, social media promotion, Post coordination, scholarship presentations, donations, meeting motions, student follow-up and recognition plans. homeschool groups, libraries, youth groups, JROTC programs, and community art organizations. If in doubt, ask me!

January 31	1st place winner in each grade division from Department must be received by National for judging.
 ★ Who Can Enter - Open to students in grades K–8 enrolled in public, private, parochial, home school, U.S. territories/possessions, or eligible overseas school programs. - Students do not need to be related to a VFW or VFW Auxiliary member. - Students must be lawful U.S. permanent residents or have applied for permanent residency and intend to become U.S. citizens. - Foreign exchange students, students age 15 or older, and previous national winners in the same grade division are not eligible.	 ★ Artwork Rules - Artwork must be original, two-dimensional, and completed during the current school year. - Use canvas or paper only; canvas must be on a stretcher frame or canvas board, and paper must be reinforced with heavy paper. - Size must be between 8" x 10" and 18" x 24", including mat. - Accepted media include acrylic, chalk, crayon, ink, marker, pastel, pen, pencil, tempera, watercolor, glitter, and similar media. - No wood, metal, plastic, or glass frames. Mats are allowed. - Coloring sheets, digital art, and photography are not accepted. - Submit a completed, legible entry form with parent/guardian signatures. Print student name, age, and grade level on the back of the artwork.
