WHAT'S CONSIDERED AUXILIARY OUTREACH

- Most importantly the project must be approved by the Auxiliary and recorded in the meeting minutes **PRIOR** to the project.
- Participation in a Walk-a-Thon – examples, event spotter, water station volunteer, timekeeper, etc. Walking in the event **DOES NOT COUNT**.
- Working with your local police department – example, child ID kits.
- Working with your local fire department – examples, fire safety and prevention
- Working with EMT's to host CPR training
- Volunteering at an animal shelter – bringing items is not considered outreach.
- Volunteering at local soup kitchen
- Delivering food for Meals on Wheels
- Volunteering at Habitat for Humanity



KEY WORD HERE IS VOLUNTEERING!!!!

Volunteer work that is for the **benefit** of the **Auxiliary** or **Post** is **NOT** considered outreach service. So, cooking for a fundraiser for Post or Auxiliary, “Buddy” Poppy distribution, and church activities for one specific congregation is **NOT** outreach.
