Start the Year Off on the Right Foot

This relatively new Program has been challenging for members, but is really quite simple. It all boils down to *volunteering!* This first Newsletter will walk you through the do's and don'ts of this program.

What Does Qualify vs. What Does Not Qualify as Auxiliary Outreach

QUALIFIES	DOES NOT QUALIFY
Volunteering in homeless shelter kitchen serving meals, bussing tables or cleaning up.	Donating trophies to a youth sports group.
Partnering with police or fire Department on bicycle or home safety training classes.	Hosting a luncheon/dinner for local community groups or police/fire/first responders
Approval on Auxiliary floor to volunteer (pass out water, help register, etc.) a local cancer group setting up their local "walk-a-thon".	Sending an Auxiliary check to support a charity that organized a walk-a-thon or run.
Volunteering with local agencies to clean up local parks or beaches.	Collecting clothing or other items for homeless veterans at the Post Home (this is Veterans & Family Support).
Partnering with a group (boy scouts, girl scouts, etc.) to collect food donations for local food pantries.	Taking comfort items to local shelters, rehab centers, hospitals, etc.

This program is all about **volunteering and partnering**; it is **NOT** about donating money or items – you are partnering and giving of your time!

Remember that any project that can be reported under any of our other Programs is **NOT** reportable under Auxiliary Outreach!

Follow these simple steps and you will have a successful program year!!

- Check VFW Store for Poppy special items to help pass out and promote.
- Refer to the online Buddy Poppy manual for tips, guidelines, and ideas for a successful drive, under program & Publicity Resources in MALTA
- Advertise, contact Radio Stations for interviews, send out Press Releases to your media contacts
- Use Facebook to promote, where and when for distribution and publish your photos showing your auxiliary in action.



Standing Rules - Purpose

To establish guides for specified operations, activities, events, expenses and disbursements between Auxiliary meetings. They may state what to pay, when and to whom. See *Building on the Foundation* page 28 and Article II, Sec 211 of the

- Motions to provide for specified operations, activities, events, expenses and disbursements between meetings.
- Cannot conflict with National or Department Bylaws.
- Can be amended, modified or rescinded.
- Good idea to review the standing rules annually.

Good and Bad examples of Standing Rules

NOT GOOD / WHY	GOOD
Treasurer allowed to pay obligation. (Needs to be specific to what obligations)	Treasurer allowed to pay Bond, Health & Happines, Hospital Pledge, and Hospital
Send flowers to hospitalized members (Needs to specify an amount)	Booster Send flowers to hospitalized members not to exceed \$50
Delegates get paid to go to Department meetings, (needs more specific guidelines)	Delegates get paid \$100 to attend to Department meetings, must attend all meetings and report back to Auxiliary
President can spend \$100 each month at their discretion. (Needs to be specific for what the money is spent on)	President can spend up to \$100 each month for Auxiliary fund raising supplies and/or items to benefit the Auxiliary.

Auxiliaries at all levels may establish Standing Rules to provide for specified operations, activities, events, expenses and disbursements between meetings, provided such rules do not conflict with the National or Department Bylaws.


