

Positive Member Experience—Check on members and their wellbeing


- Offer kind words of concern


RETENTION

Big News: PCAFC Expansion Coming!

The VA is set to begin Phase 2 Expansion of the Program of Comprehensive Assistance for Family Caregivers (PCAFC) on October 1, 2022. This phase will open PCAFC to Veterans who served <u>after May 7, 1975 and before September 11, 2001, making Veterans of all eras eligible to apply to PCAFC.</u>
