"Stand Up, Speak Out"

Dept. President, Teresa Bachand's, 23/24 special project: share and make members aware: MST – Military Sexual Trauma - Sexual trauma experienced while in the military service affects both men and women—with serious and longterm consequences. According to the Department of Defense, more than 7,600 individuals reported a sexual assault in fiscal year (FY) 2018, which is the most recent data available.2 This statistic is an increase of about 12.6 percent from 2017. Understandably, many veterans who have experienced MST are reluctant to report the sexual assault either at the time of its occurrence or even much later. It is vital that VA makes every effort to properly communicate available MST services to veterans and that both VHA and VBA staff work expeditiously and with sensitivity to ensure the provision of needed care, treatment, and benefits.

Suggest you reach out to your local VA Medical facilities and ask for contact MST counselor for veterans to be a guest speaker at one of your monthly meetings.
