Our Dogs

We breed, raise, and train Labrador retrievers. Our education, socialization, fitness, and training strategies lead our dogs through career paths from our Puppy Academy (preschool and kindergarten) to puppy raiser homes to Canine University for advanced skills training and ultimately to commencement. As

our dogs progress in their training, their unique aptitudes and abilities become clear. Based on their personality, health, temperament, trainability, and suitability for specific careers, most of our dogs enroll in one of the following programs. All are provided at no cost.

Dogs and programs for people with vision loss:

- Guide Dogs help people with vision loss navigate independently; trained in over 40 skills.
- Kids Companion Dogs skilled companion dogs enhance independence for children with vision loss, preparing the way for a future guide dog.
- Guide Dog Camp provides 14- to 17-year-old teens with vision loss and their parents a no-cost, overnight, two-day camp to learn all about working with a guide dog.

Dogs for veterans:

- Guide Dogs help veterans with vision loss navigate independently; trained in over 40 skills.
- Service Dogs help veterans with post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD) and other disabilities; trained in 15 – 20 skills.
- Facility Therapy Dogs provide comfort in military medical facilities and high-stress military environments nationwide.
- Emotional Support Dogs benefit veterans and help restore a more active lifestyle.
- Gold Star Family Dogs comfort military family members who have lost a loved one in active service to the nation.

Dogs for children and teens:

- Guide Dogs help teens with vision loss—ages 15 and up—navigate independently.
- Kids Companion Dogs skilled companion dogs enhance independence for children with vision loss—ages 5 to 17—preparing the way for a future guide dog.
- Gold Star Family Dogs comfort military family members who have lost a loved one in active service to the nation.

Dogs for genetics & reproduction:

• Breeder Dogs – selected for their fine qualities and traits to ensure continuity of our lines; matched and placed in pre-screened volunteer host homes.
