Disaster Relief and Helena Help Information

As we all know several of our Districts have been hit from this storm. I have received some information that can help those in need.

Any Post or members that are affected by Helena, World Central Kitchen now has disaster relief feeding locations in Florida for hurricane victims and Volunteers. Theywill be serving food in these areas all day every day until the areas are safe and food stable. We will do our best to keep you all updated when new kitchens are added.

Remember that every little bit helps. I have been told that they can also help Veteransin these areas with other needs or point them in the right direction for further assistance.

They are trying to have reps from agencies stationed at these feeding locations. These stations become a major hub for information.

Also, if any of your members are cut off on Barrier Islands, Word Central Kitchen is delivering meals by helicopter to those areas until they're able to mobilize on the ground. This is helpful information for those also who are on the Florida Georgia Border. Some will be able to get help from GA faster or easier. I am in direct contact with a radio Station working with a Volunteer at WCK on the ground in the Cedar Key area. WCK is a World Central Kitchen Chef Jose Andreas' disaster/wartime relief organization.

They've become as important as the Red Cross in times of strife. https://wck.org/ Again, as new and updated information comes in we will do our best to get it to you quickly.
