National Security, Foreign Affairs, POW/MIA

To fully support the all-volunteer force, protect our nation's citizens, and defend American interests around the world, Congress and DOD must:

- Ensure DPAA is fully funded to perform its personnel recovery mission.
- Expand partnerships with host nations and private/public organizations to achieve the fullest possible accounting of U.S. military personnel missing from all wars.
- Deter threats to our national security by supporting our allies in Ukraine, Israel, Korea, and Taiwan.
- Ensure all service members who served in harm's way, to include foreign nationals, receive the recognition, care, and benefits they have earned.
- Provide recognition and support for Afghan and Iraqi translators and allies.
- Award the Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal for operations in Eastern Europe.





Monthly Program Focus: Legislative

We the Auxiliary; Can Be An Advocate, Be Informed, Be Engaged.

Things you can do:

- Keep learning the priority goals
- Keep encouraging people to sign up for Action Corps
- Keep reading pending legislation and acting on them If you are writing BILLS to your representatives, please communicate with our VFW Legislative advocates. They will help you in the process. Communication is essential for successfully completing our goals.
- We can educate our local leaders by writing letters, making phone calls and sending emails. You can invite them to your Post for special events or patriotic celebrations. Let your members tell their experiences, frustrations and triumphs.
- Auxiliaries must remain impartial. When seeking support
 to pass upcoming legislation or for a special project, you
 can invite your current representative, regardless of
 party. However, when hosting events for election
 purposes, you should invite candidates from all the
 parties. Either way, collaborating with your VFW on
 these events that connects members to local
 lawmakers will qualify Auxiliaries for the National award.

Are you having a Freedom Festival?

Create legislative games, have a skit, design an age appropriate coloring or activity book. Have a table set up to sign people up for Action Corps. Teach priority goals and hand out the Action Corps brochure to your guest.
