I am so very proud of all the hard work and efforts that you have but in to work our programs and support our Veterans and Families.


I would like to encourage you all to start taking a good look at what you need to complete your year and reports and review your Circle Criteria. You Can Do This! Many of you are already over halfway there.

Honoring a legacy

VFW Auxiliary continues veteran's holiday card mission after her untimely passing

A U.S. Air Force veteran who became a quadriplegic and spent a year at a VA hospital made it her mission to send holiday cards to fellow veterans in hospitals and nursing homes.

Sadly, Renee Whisner passed away suddenly on Christmas Day in 2023, although the Naples resident was able to get thousands of cards into the hands of veterans during the past few holiday seasons.

But today, her dream is being continued, thanks to numerous volunteers at Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 7721 in the Golden Gate community.

The VFW's auxiliary members have decided to keep it going with a project called "Mission: Operation Christmas Cards for Veterans," in memory of Whisner, who was a member of the VFW.

Whisner, who became a quadriplegic in 2014, started the mission to send holi iday cards containing personal notes to fellow veterans after spending a year at the James A. Haley Veterans Hospital in Tampa.

In 2021, the first year she started, 5,000 Christmas cards were sent. The next year, 7,000 cards were sent, and finally, in her last year, Whisner sent 11,000.

Before her passing, Whisner made

her mother promise to carry on her mission and to increase the numbers each doing just that and asked for the VFW Auxiliary to adopt the project and to in-

crease the goal to 25,000 cards in 2024. "I promised Renee I would carry on with her mission," said Treadway. "It meant so much to her, and it gave her a wonderful purpose in life, along with being a prayer chaplain at her Unity of

Naples Church. She was a proud veteran and served her country -- we want to keep her mission alive in her honor." Cards will be mailed to veterans in VA hospitals and nursing homes in Florida,

Alabama, Kentucky, Georgia, North Carolina, South Carolina and possibly one or two more states as funds allow. Requests for cards have come from as far away as South Dakota, and the goal is to mail all by Dec. 1.

The auxiliary is covering the cost of the mission with the support of donations. Postage alone will exceed \$1,000 this year. The auxiliary has scheduled and organized volunteers to stuff the cards with personal notes written by students from over 20 area schools located in Naples, Bonita Springs and Estero. Each student is given index cards to write personal messages to the veterans. The simple act of kindness means the world to a veteran in a hospital bed or a nursing home, said Treadway. Donations to help underwrite the

Donations to help underwrite the costs for additional cards and postage may be sent via check made payable to the VFW Auxiliary (earmarked - Veterans Christmas Cards) and mailed to VFW Post #7721 Auxiliary, 13131 Collier Blvd., Naples, 34119. The auxiliary is a nonprofit organization so donations are tax deductible. The VFW Auxiliary is one of the na-

How are you recruiting? Most people today do not have time for small talk, ask for their phone number, then you can text them the QR code, ask for emails so you can send membership applications. Many people especially younger members are more technology savvy and would rather use technology to communicate. Where do you find the QR code? It's in MALTA under membership for a clear copy.

Yes, we MAY use the photo of the headstone as proof of qualifying service, if it is the headstone provided by the Department of Defense (i.e.. the white ones/government issued), not one provided by the family.

In order to receive that headstone, the cemetery/funeral home has to verify the deceased DD214 in order to request that stone. So, we're good on that part. As for dates of service, my advice is to approximate the dates of service as closely as you are able and don't leave the slot blank.
