On Feb 24, 2023, Auxiliary 8093 took a road trip from Debary to Tampa to tour the Southeastern Guide Dog facility. This is an amazing place and these beautiful dogs are a blessing to so many of our Veterans and families. We are so proud to contribute and be part of our President Cindy Estell's Special Project.





Q. Where can we find entries for special awards?

A. You can find the entries on the Department website (vfwauxfl.org) under Resources then downloadable info which lists all the entry Q, forms for all programs or in **MALTA** under Member Resources. You must select each program to get the form. All entries are due to the Department Chairman bv March 31.

Q. When do we nominate and elect officers?

A. According to Article VIII, Sec 804 A second bullet "Elective Officers shall be NOMINATED AND ELECTED at regular meeting in April." This means that nominations are not held at a different meeting.

Q. What is a District convention?

A. According to Article V, Sec

504 first bullet "Each District shall hold an annual District Convention TO ELECT OFFICERS, TO TRANSACT BUSINESS." In addition, it states that "the convention shall be held not less than ten (10) calendar days and not more that seventy five (75) calendar days prior to convening of the Department Convention." Department Convention will be convened on June 15, District conventions cannot be held before April 1 and after May 31.

Q. Are delegates elected or appointed?

A. According to Article III, Sec 301, "An member in good standing in their respective Auxiliary shall be eligible for ELECTION...." Delegates to District, Department and National are elected.

Q. Are delegate fees required to be paid?

A. There is no delegate fee for District or National delegates. However, according to Article III, Sec 304 second main bullet "In Departments in which the Department Bylaws provide, a delegate fee shall be paid by each Auxiliary for each and every Delegate to which the Auxiliary is entitled." The Department By-laws call

for a \$5 delegate fee. second sub-bullet adds "The delegate fee shall be forwarded by each and every Auxiliary regardless of the number of delegates present at the annual Department Convention...." This means that your Auxiliary must pay for the total number delegates your Auxiliary is eligible for even if none attend the Convention.

Q. What is the last day to do program reports?

A. The Program Reporting system will be taken down for input on April 15 so reports must be in by April 14. It is taken down so that chairmen and officers can judge the reports in preparation for awards at Department Convention.

Q. Will there be a parade for Special Project checks at Convention?

A. No, all donations for Special Projects (Southeast Guide Dogs) must be in to the Department Treasurer by April 30.
